Describe two best practices successfully implemented by the Institution Best Practices

1. GUJARAT GYAN GURU QUIZ (G3Q)

Title of the practice: *GUJARAT GYAN GURU QUIZ (G3Q),*

Key Words:

Total 2031 students registered, 1080 students participated, two students were awarded three lakh rupees cash prizes each, one student was awarded two lakh rupees cash prize whereas another student received one lakh and fifty thousand rupees cash prize.

Objectives of the Practice:

The GUJARAT GYAN GURU QUIZ (G3Q) was a unique activity that combines education, fun with knowledge, and competition. The vision of GUJARAT GYAN GURU QUIZ (G3Q) is to motivate students. It will improve and promote participation, knowledge, and awareness among students of the State. The goal of Gujarat Gyan Guru Quiz is to significantly increase students' enthusiasm. The quiz format engages students and motivates them to gain and retain knowledge. Participating in the quiz develops students' skills like quick recall, critical thinking and teamwork. The exposure to diverse questions from different topics and disciplines broadens students' overall knowledge and horizons.

The Context:

In case student wins, there may be linkage issue among aadhar card, mobile number and bank account number of the students. To encourage the weak students who were unable to access the internet was a big challenge.

The Practice:

This Quiz added significant educational value to each student's education. The quiz was more inclusive, as students belonging from across the state can participate irrespective of location, board, medium of education, or gender.

Evidence of Success:

In our college, total 2031 students registered in GUJARAT GYAN GURU QUIZ (G3Q), among them 1080 students have participated in the competition in which 125 students received complimentary prize. Mahadev Dhayol, B. Sc. Sem- 4, received three lakh cash prize and got first in district, Agajibhai Chaudhari, M. Sc. Sem-4, received three lakh cash prize and got second in state, Brijesh Parmar, B. Sc. Sem-4, received two lakh cash prize and got second in

district, Sanjay Prajapati, M. Com. Sem-4, received one lakh fifty thousand cash prize and third in state.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

Our college is located in a semi urban area and most of the students studying here did not have smart mobile phones, so it was a difficult task for us to provide smart phones for registration of such students.

2. Disaster Training Camp (NSS)

Title of the practice: *Disaster Training Camp (NSS),*

Key Words:

Inspired by HNGU, emergency treatment, CPR, Fire safety, Ambulance services, natural disaster

Objectives of the Practice:

Such programs were organized with the aim of creating awareness among the students regarding medical and natural disasters and benefiting the society through these students. The aim of this Disaster Training Camp is to increase knowledge and understanding of the disaster phenomenon in its different dimensions of risk, context, impacts and environmental and public health consequences. The objectives of this camp are to collate all the information needed for effective management of disasters in the college, to establish an emergency response system in college, to create awareness and build the capacity of the college community.

The Context:

There were many challenges to invite agency related to disaster, to prepare students for this programme, to take care of the students, hospitability of the students. The main problem was to take permissions of the District Disaster Management Department should be convenience both sides.

The Practice:

Disaster management camp of the college works in creating awareness among students. Camp provides basic training to the students to ensure safety during a threatening disaster situation. The cell conduct various mock drills to prepare students as well as faculty to meet emergency situations. Under the auspices of Hemchandrachary North Gujarat University, Patan and our college organized a Three-Day Disaster Training Camp during 16-18 January 2023. Speaker Prof Trilokkumar N Thakar, Deputy District Commander, Porbandar, imparted training on how to save ourselves at the time of Disaster. This training was organized for emergency treatment,

CPR, Fire safety. Speaker explained us the importance of Ambulance services. Moreover, trainer demonstrated how to deal with natural disaster, earth quake, flood and tsunami.

Evidence of Success:

71 students from different colleges affiliated to the HNGU, Patan participated in this three day Disaster Training Camp. Students were demonstrated practical knowledge in the training session. They were well versed with the techniques from this camp. Press note and photos were attached.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required:
